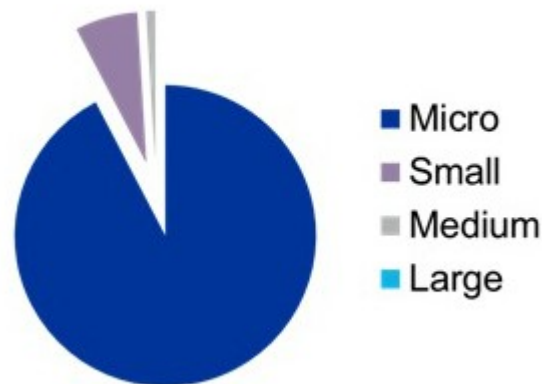
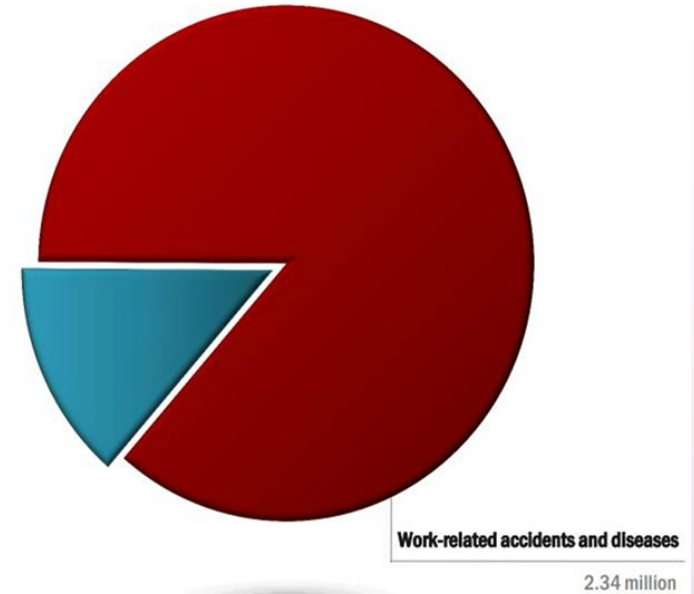
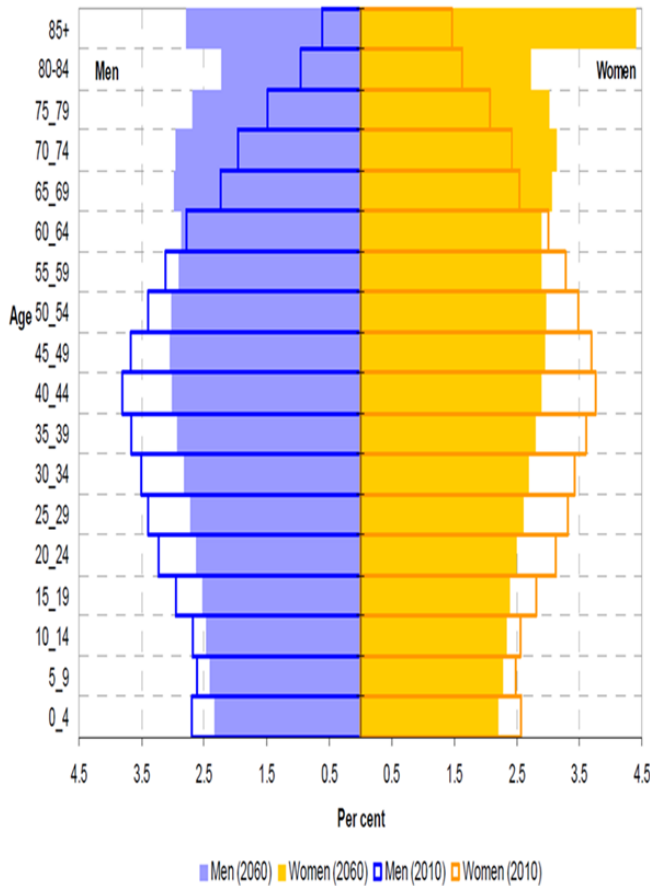
The EU OSH system



EU Strategic Framework: Identified challenges

- **Implementation**
 - Different approaches to implementation in EU
 - Particular challenge for micro and small enterprises
- **Work-related diseases**
 - 4-8% of cancers due to occupational exposure
 - Work place stress, musculoskeletal disorders
- **Demographic change**
 - Working population between 55-64 set to increase
 - Older workers need to stay healthy to retirement

EU OSH Strategic Framework 2014 – 2020: Objectives

- Consolidation of national OSH strategies
- Practical support to MSEs
- Better enforcement by Member States
- Simplifying existing legislation
- Specific challenges
 - Addressing the ageing workforce
 - Improving prevention of WR Diseases
 - Tackling existing and new risks
- Improving statistical data collection
- Action with international organisations

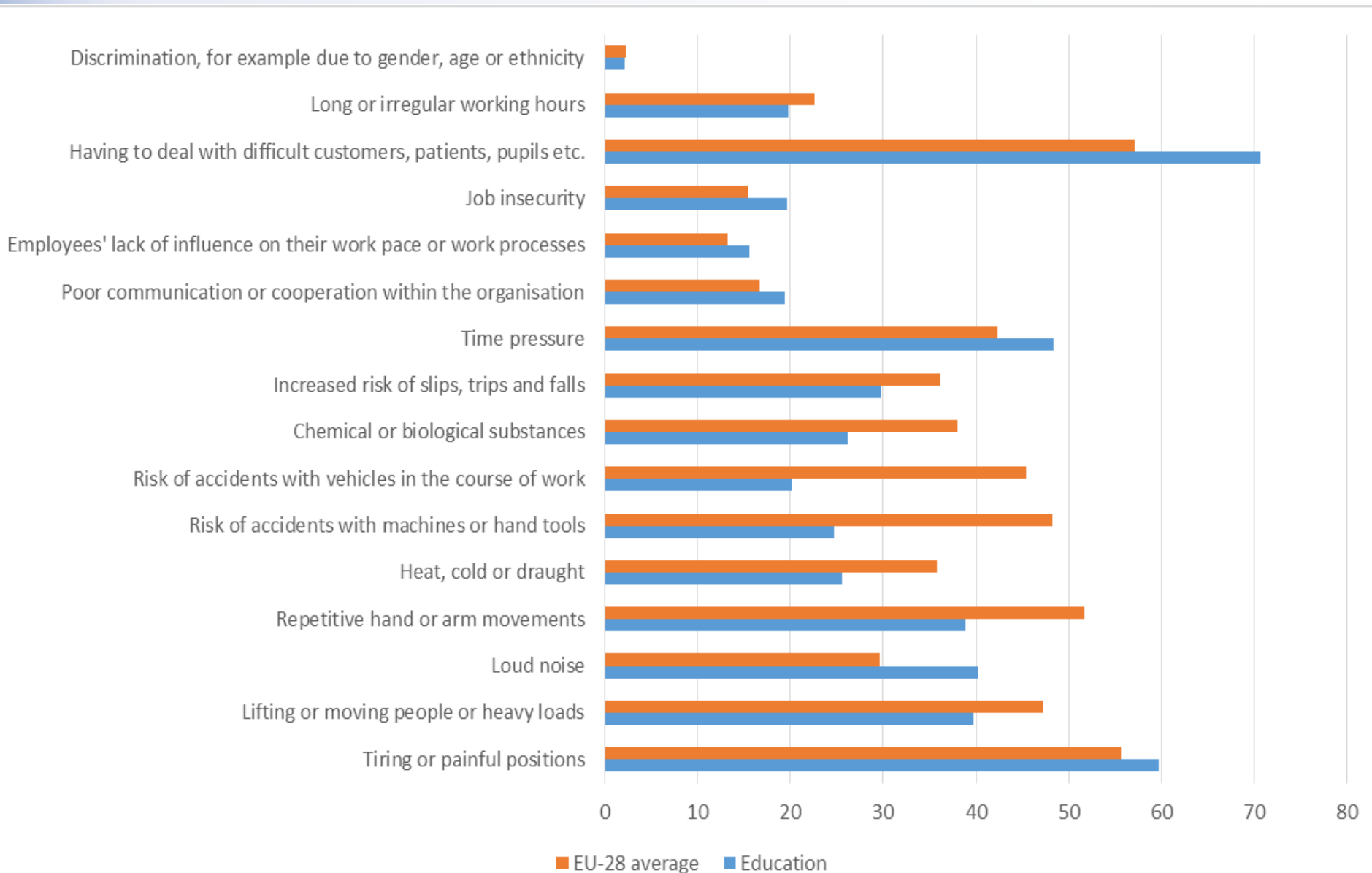
Percentage of workers in education in micro-workplaces – 20%

Education sector workplaces visited by labour inspectorate 38%

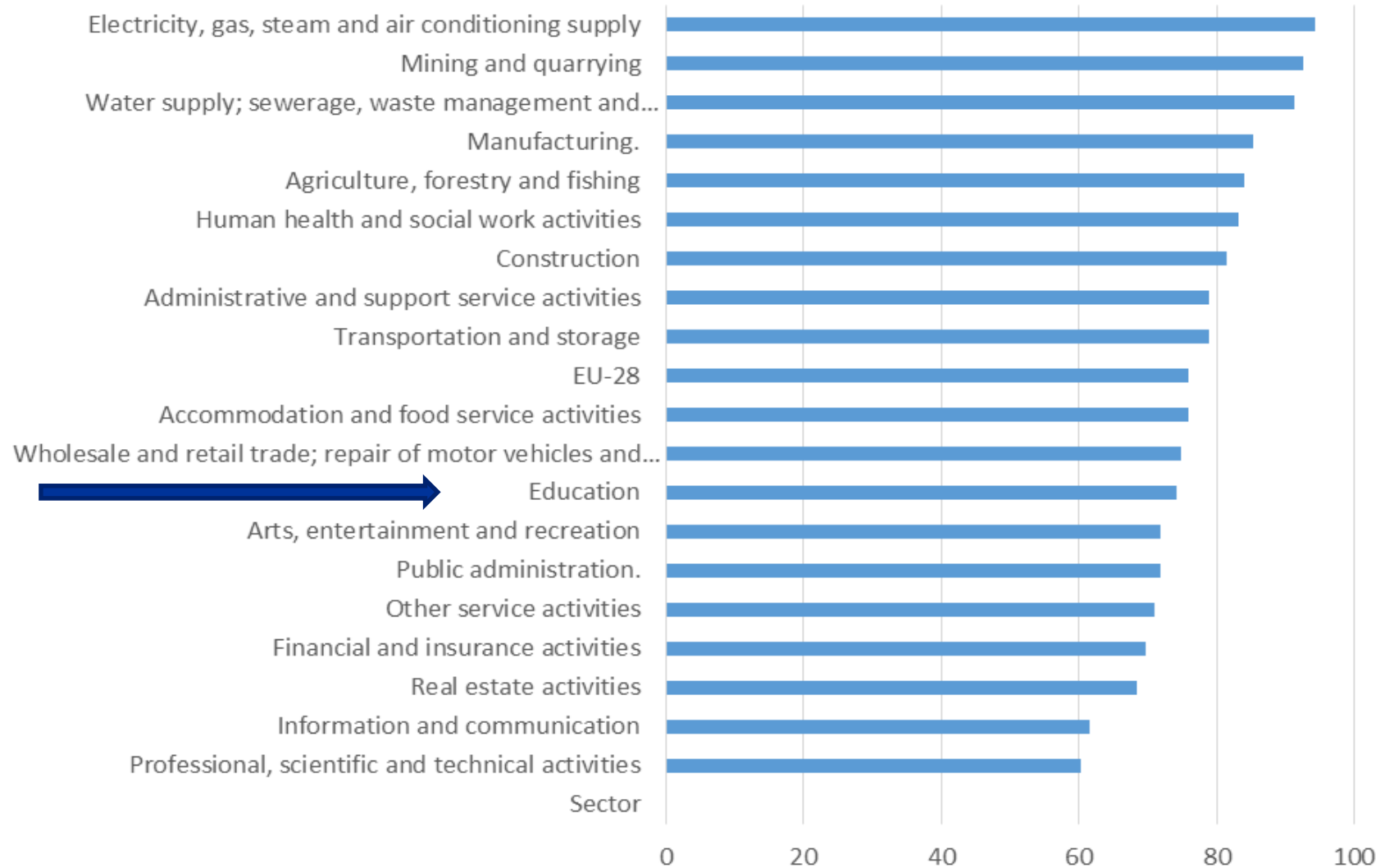
Percentage workers in education 50 years and over: 33%

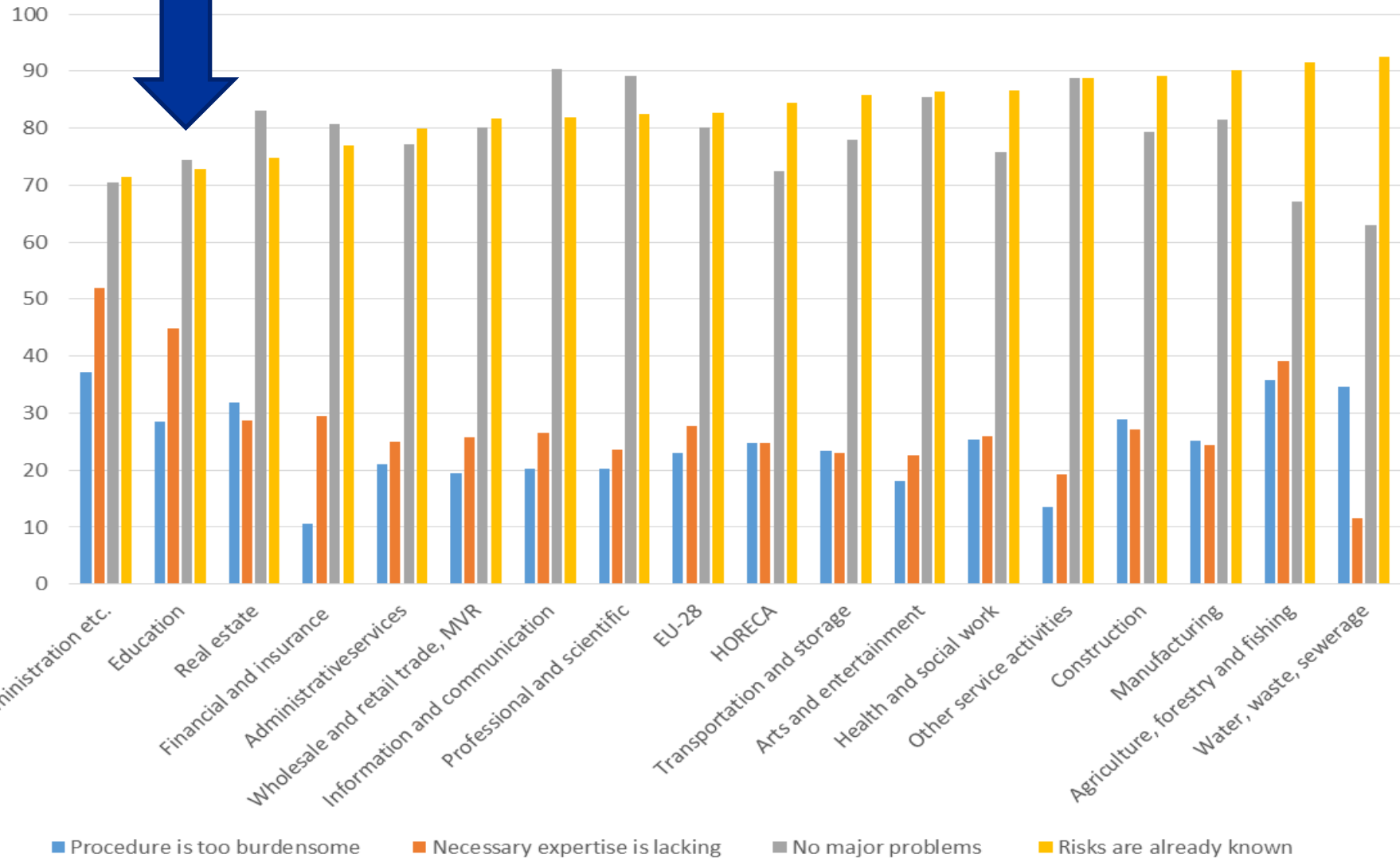


Risk assessment carried out by sector (ESENER II)



Why no risk assessment? (ESENER II)

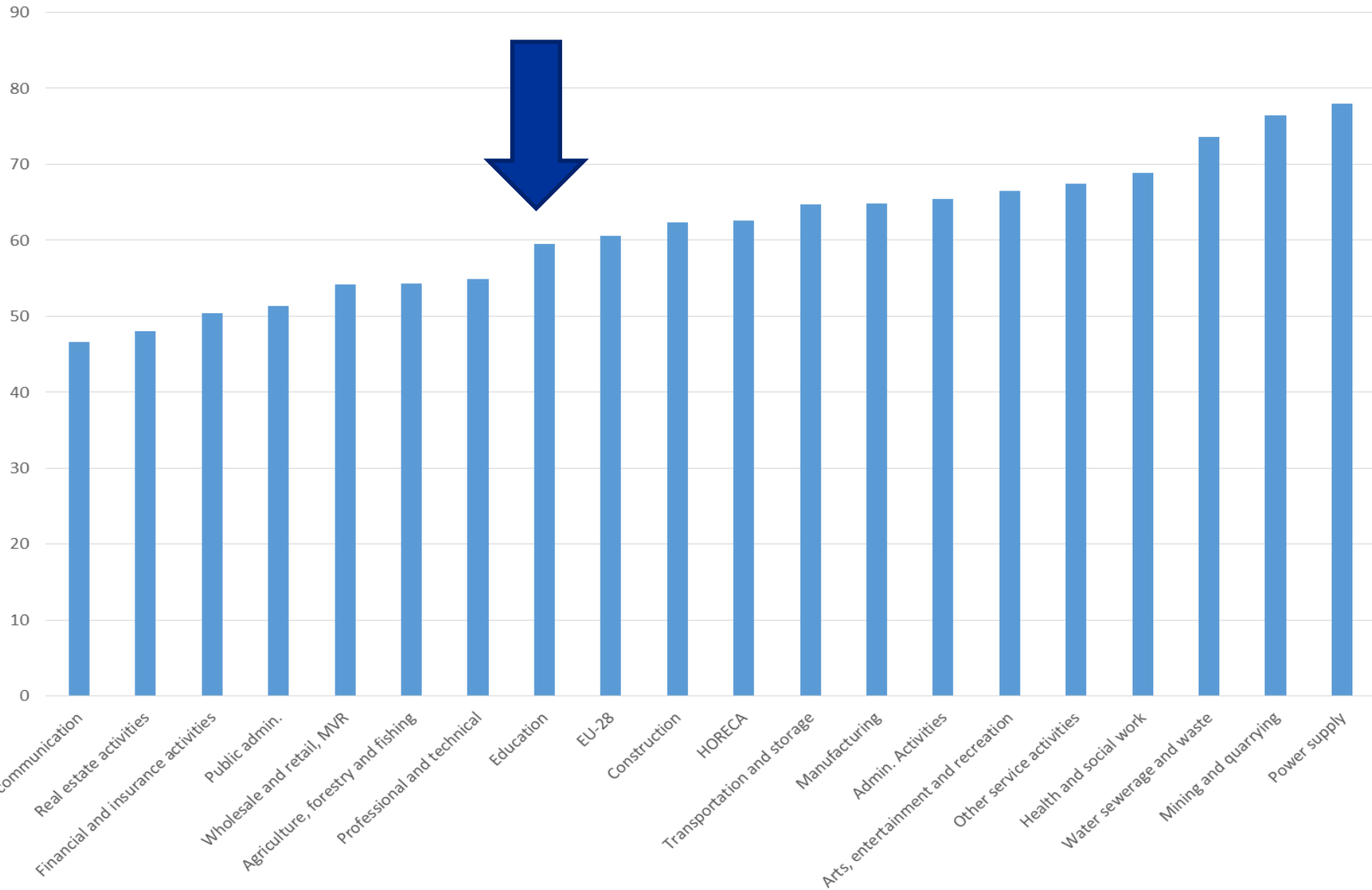
Reasons why workplace risk assessments are not carried out regularly, by activity sector (% establishments, EU-28).

 ■ Risks are already known

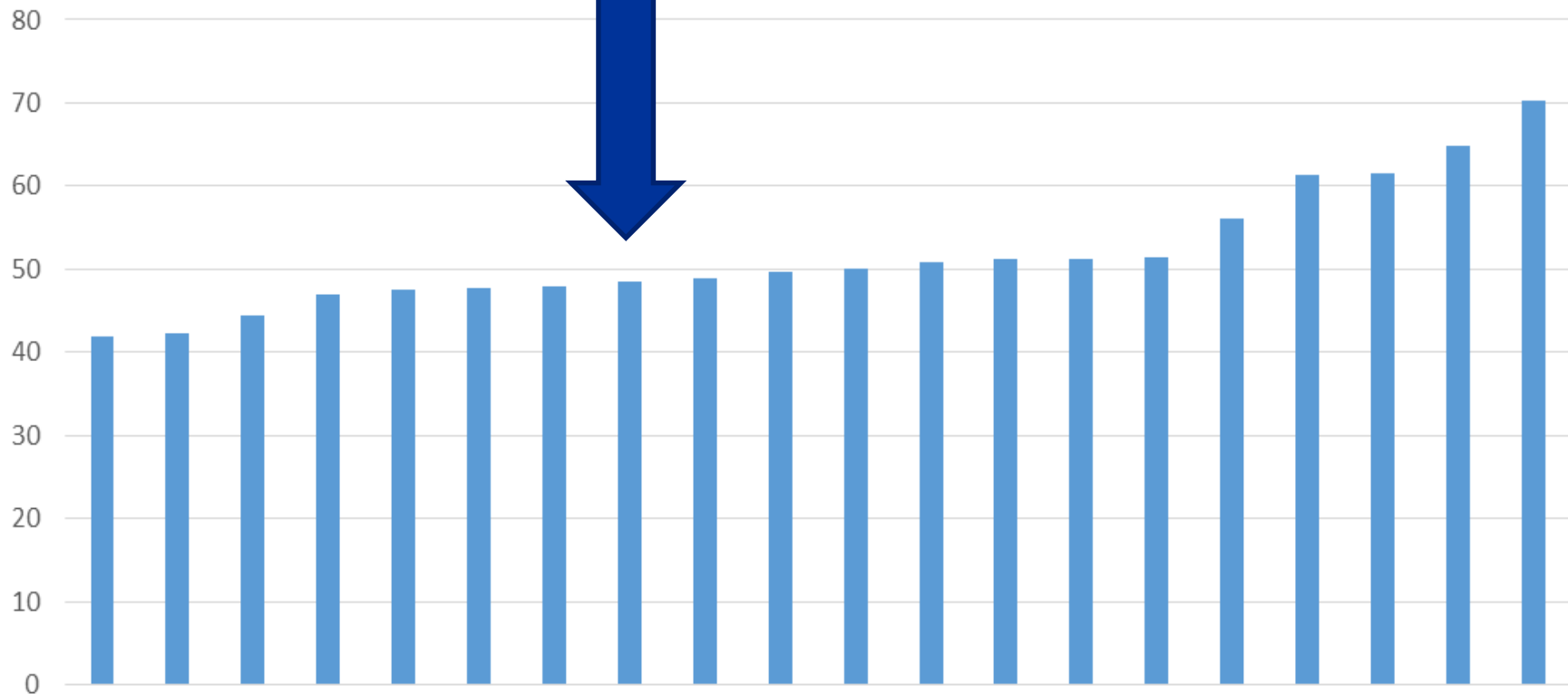
Health and safety discussed by management? (ESENER II)

Sickness absence analysis (ESENER II)

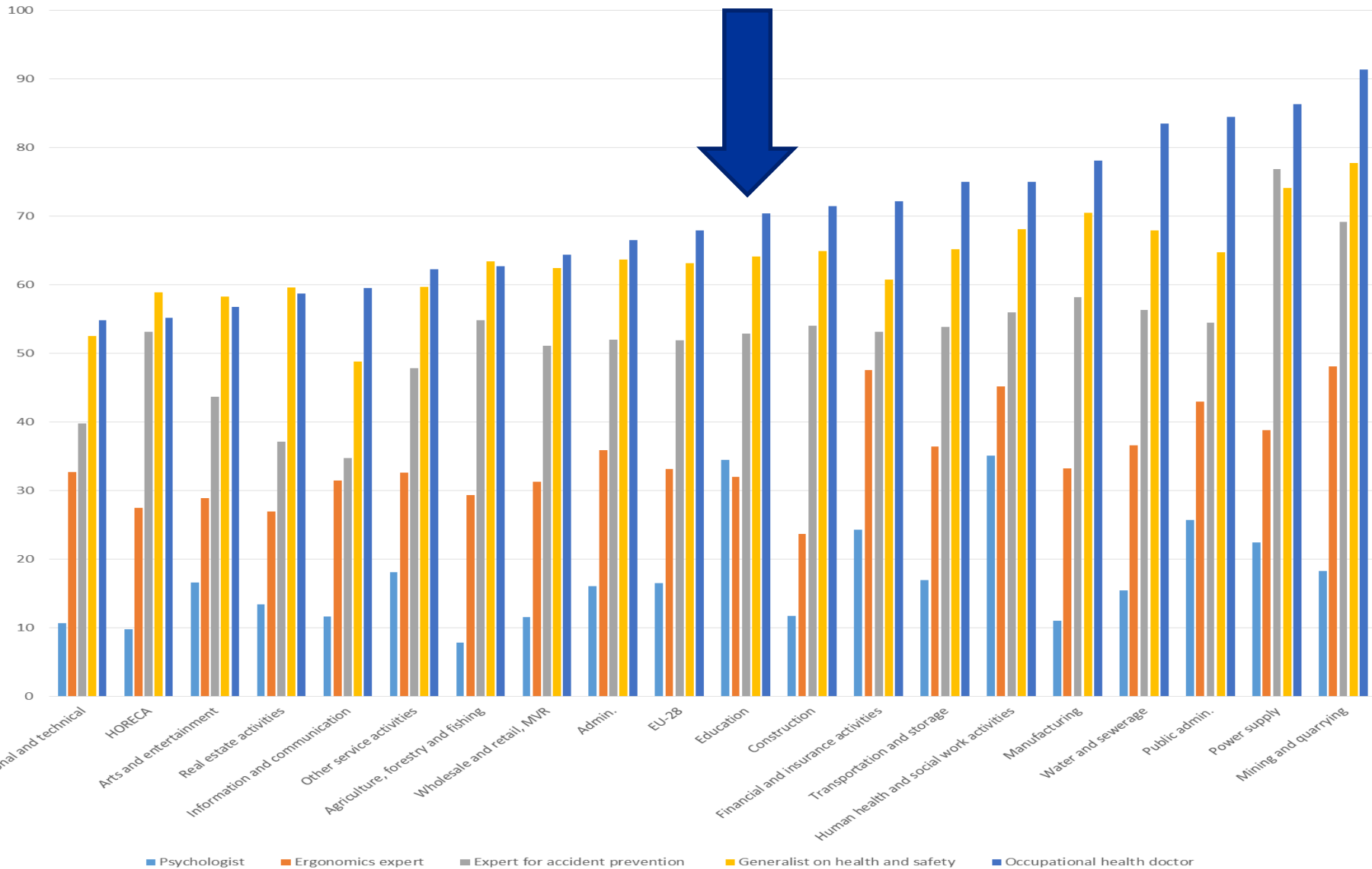
There is a routine analysis of sickness absence? Yes responses (%)



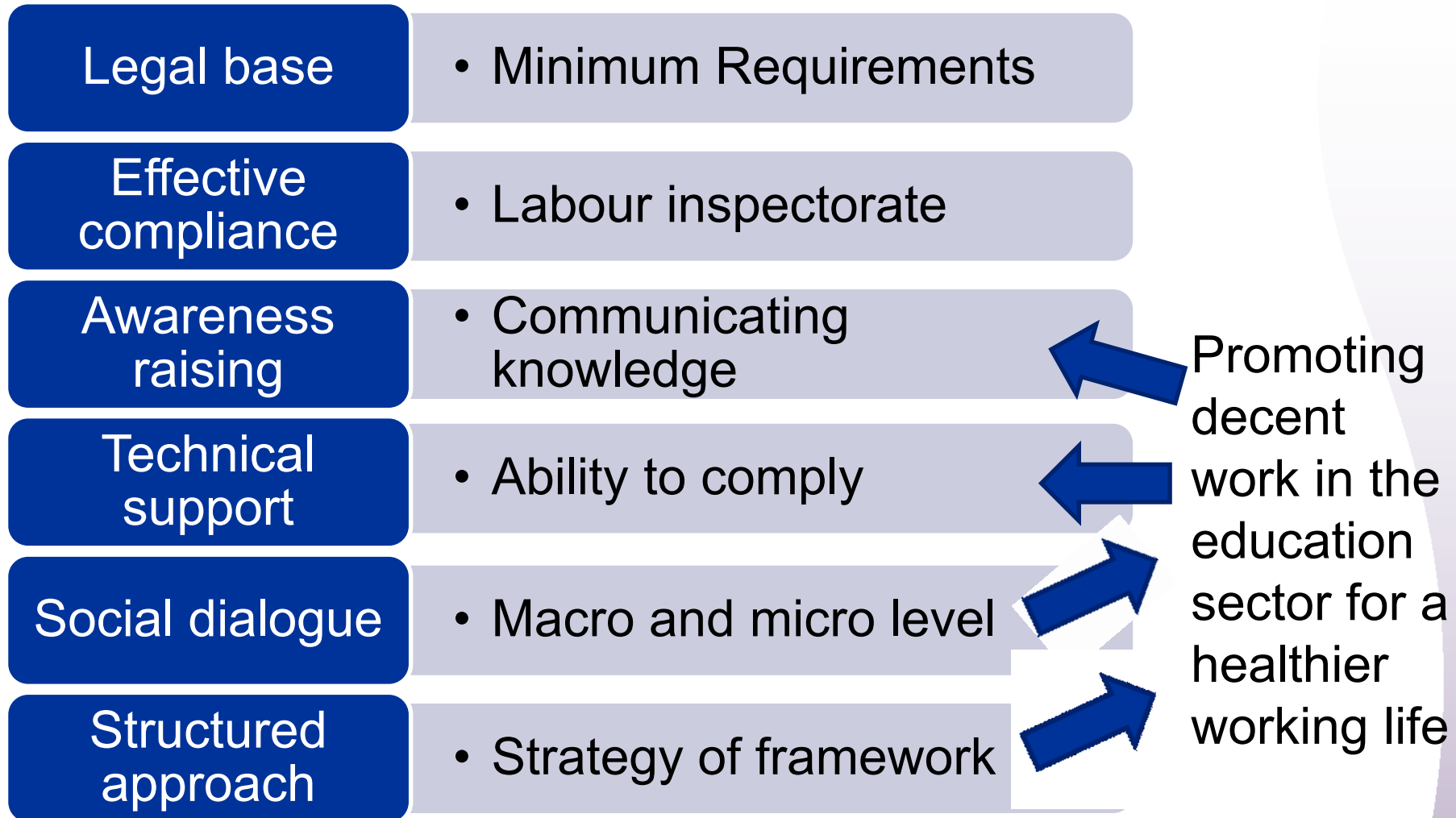
